



WHAT ARE COOKIES?

Have you ever revisited a website and its bought up something you were looking at before? Or perhaps it's welcomed you as a second time user with something like "welcome back here is a % off for returning?"

This is because the site uses cookies. A cookie is a piece of text sent to your browser by a website you visit. It helps the site remember information about your visit, which can make it easier to visit the site again and make the site more useful to you.

What does it mean when a site uses cookies?

Cookies are an discretionary part of your internet experience. If you choose, you can limit what cookies end up on your computer or mobile device. If you allow cookies, it will streamline your browsing experience. For some users, no cookies security risk is more important than a convenient internet experience.

Should I accept cookies?

When you visit a website that uses cookies, a cookie file is saved to your PC, Mac, phone or tablet. If its your first time visiting that website a pop up will appear with something to the effect of "this site uses cookies, to accept please click the accept button below, or if not the decline button".

It stores the website's name, and also a unique ID that represents you as a user. That way, if you go back to that website again, the website knows you've already been there before.

How do I check my cookies?

From the home screen tap the 'Settings' icon, then choose 'Safari'.
Scroll to the bottom of the page and tap 'Advanced'.
Tap 'Website Data' to see a list of cookies. Please note, Android does not allow you to view or check individual cookies.
