# **TYPES OF GRANTS**

## **ELIGIBILITY**

Eligibility grants will give you a list of criteria that you need to qualify for.
Usually these grants are offered on a 'first come, first serve' basis.



#### **COMPETITIVE**

Whilst you will still have criteria you need to meet for these, here you are competing with other organisations and it is granted to the best candidate considered by the funding body.

# WITH VARIOUS CATEGORIES

# **Program Development Support**

The most popular grants, Program Support provide funding for specific projects or programs. Generally, these are restricted grants, where recipients must only use funds for the exact purpose outlined in the grant proposal.

# **Capital Funding Support**

Capital Funding Support Grants are most commonly for capital projects such as building construction or property acquisition.

### **In-Kind Donation Grants**

Sometimes, organisations are in need of resources other than monetary funding. Subsequently, In-Kind Support Grants provide alternative assistance in nonmonetary forms, such as donations of equipment and supplies, or free consulting.

## **General Operating Support**

General Operating Support grants can help to offset almost any operating expense for your organisation. In addition, operating support grants are less restrictive than program support grants.

## **Research Grants**

Research Grants are frequently awarded to individuals or teams associated with institutes of higher education and research-oriented organisations.

## **Matching Grants**

Finally, there are Matching Grants, also known as 'cost matching'.

With this type of grant, a funding source agrees to 'match' a specific dollar amount of funds, but only if the applicant raises at least that same amount.
